A database is a collection of information organized for easy use on the computer. **Encyclopaedia Britannica Online** is one example of a database. The online edition includes the complete **Encyclopaedia Britannica**, plus **Merriam-Webster's Collegiate Dictionary** and **Thesaurus** and the **Britannic Book of the Year**. EB Online also offers video clips, a world atlas, featured articles and a Spanish-English dictionary, as well as an internet directory to thousands of web sites chosen, reviewed and rated by the editors of Encyclopaedia Britannica.

It's all yours and it's all free with your library card. Just go to www.westhamptonlibrary.org and click on Databases and Web sites to get started.

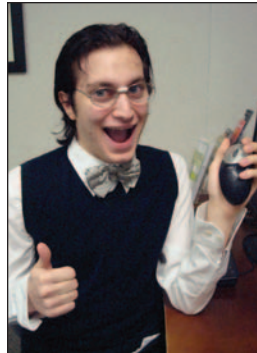
