Provisional charter of
Westhampton Free Library Association

Whereas a petition for incorporation as an institution of the University has been duly received, and
Whereas official inspection shows that partial provision has been made for buildings, furniture,
equipment and for proper maintenance, and that all other prescribed requirements will be fully met
Therefore, being satisfied that public interests will be promoted by such incorporation, the Regents by
virtue of the authority conferred on them by law hereby incorporate provisionally

Daniel E. Smith, Ernest H. Bishop

and their ~~successors~~^{associates} under the corporate name of Westhampton Free Library Association
with all powers, privileges and duties, and subject to all limitations and restrictions prescribed for such
corporations by law or by the ordinances of the University of the State of New York. The first trustees
of said corporation shall be the incorporators first above named. Their successors shall be elected by the
corporation, one each year to serve five years.

This corporation shall be located at Westhampton, Suffolk county, New York.

If all requirements prescribed by law or by the University ordinances be fully met within five years,
then this charter shall be made absolute, but otherwise on March 1, 1902, on notice from the Regents to
this effect, it shall terminate and become void and shall be surrendered to the Regents.
