






Foul is Fair by Hannah Capin (YA)


Lady Macbeth by Susan Fraser King


All Our Yesterdays by Joel H. Morris

Born in a noble household, a young girl carries the guilt of her mother's death and the weight of an unknowable prophecy. Married at fifteen, she must navigate the violence of a sadistic husband and a kingdom constantly at war. To survive with her young son in a superstitious realm, she must rely on her own cunning and wit, especially when her husband dies. Suspicious of the dark devices that may have led to his father's death, her son watches as his mother falls in love with the enigmatic thane Macbeth. The new Lady Macbeth secures the protection of her family and confronts a world of masculine power. But the coronation of King Duncan and the political maneuvering of her cousin Macduff set her on a tragic course, one where her own success might mean embracing the very curse that haunts her and risking the child she loves.

Set in the 1970s in a run-down, rainy industrial town, Jo Nesbo's Macbeth's plot hinges on steadily, insidiously manipulating Inspector Macbeth: the head of SWAT and a man already susceptible to violent and paranoid tendencies.
